Scaling new heights

A note from our Business and Design Head, Swetha Manivannan

It was when I spent an impromptu 20 minutes on a seesaw with 5 children piling on the other end that my sense of joy playtime could bring with it on a daily basis was strengthened multifold. Fast forward to 2 years later, our observations and interactions with children in schools would bring to the surface, the power of play in breaking gender barriers that are often reinforced in classrooms. At Anthill, we consider ourselves play ambassadors and in the past year, we have stretched and challenged ourselves in different aspects of making play accessible to all. 'What does a child need and how to make it fun?' is a question that is etched in our approach and this led to kickstarting the year with a cluster of anganwadis in Tamilnadu where small pockets of 300-800 sq ft were transformed into colorful playscapes. We dove into creating safe, inclusive playscapes for children with visual impairment and brought to life play experiences rooted in sensory development and one that would build confidence in physical navigation. The team has taken play to different geographies from the tribal districts in Maharashtra to Meghalaya and Tripura where we celebrate a very special milestone. A playscape in Charbatapara, Meghalaya is the first playground in the entire village and it was welcomed by children, teachers, and parents alike.

Through these experiences, we have collected stories that speak on inclusivity, the increase in enrollment, attendance rates across geographies, the long hours spent outdoors, and healthy interactions between children. This, we believe, is our treasure. I would also like to highlight a wonderful partnership that heightens making play accessible- By children, For children where pre-university students spent 5 days with us to build playscapes for young under-served children. Three playscapes were built across Bangalore and we are glad to have more hands join us in our mission and also spread the message of environmental sustainability.

As we step into the 7th year with a focus to scale our impact, we channel our efforts through initiatives that will take play to children in remote regions, and aspirational districts in the northeast of India, upcycle large quantities of tyres, and also explore the possibilities of phygital play experiences.

Every child deserves a wholesome childhood. One filled with joy, exploration, nurturing, and curiosity. At our forefront is to create spaces that enable children to do this and much more.



PLAY INCLUDES EVERYONE

When we got the opportunity to build inclusive playscapes for children with visual impairment, we took as step back to understand the lack of such inclusive spaces for specially abled children. Through the two playscapes in Badlapur, Maharashtra and Kolkata, West Bengal, we explored sensory play elements that engaged children in sound, touch, feel and through materiality. The designs also focused on building confidence in physical navigation. Braille was also used to add text through welding. The word 'Anthill' was written on one of our sensory rollers with help from the Principal.

IS BUILDING A PLAYSCAPE ALWAYS FUN? A PROJECT MANAGER'S VIEW

I joined Anthill recently in Feb to explore the work and potential of architecture and design in the social sector, putting to use my skills and experience for the most underserved in our communities and the larger society. In this short time, I've already had the opportunity to work on as many as eight projects with varying degrees of involvement, two of which I executed wholly. The journey of a playscape is a fun and

exciting one right from the planning stage to the final execution with its fair share of ups and downs, each a valuable learning experience. The rush of the 7-8 days on-site during the execution can be excruciating, but very rewarding at the end when the playscape is completed. It is really heartening to see how the children, mostly from government schools, largely deprived of functional playscapes, really take to these Anthill playscapes with sheer joy, enthusiasm and gusto! Photographing these moments has been truly fulfilling. "We play here every day and love coming to school now" - is a sentence I will remember, said by a student from a remote school in the interiors of the Gadchiroli disrict.

BRINGING PLAY TO TRIBAL DISTRICTS

Rina walks to her school every morning. She walks past forest with distant wildlife, tall trees on a narrow path until she reaches a clearing in which her school is nestled. In remote tribal districts in India, many children like Rina are familiar of a school that is made up of a couple of classrooms and an empty ground.

One day, in a village called Charbatapara in the West Garo hills of Meghalaya, the empty ground had got a new identity. Colourful structures that children could climb over, crawl through, swing from and balance themselves on occupied the ground. The principal at Charbatapara Lower Primary School says, **"The kids are enjoying the playground very much and they are very happy to see it as it is the 1st playground of the village.**"About 1350 kilometers away in the tribal district of Gadchiroli, Maharashtra, the Block Education Officer of Wadsa observes that children are excited to come to school and attendance rates are increasing. A school is an important part of a childhood, it is a place to learn, develop key skills and one's personality. A school is also a place where children explore their creativity, where they are introduced to different social interactions, where they learn collaboration, conflict resolution and more. A playscape has the power to provide the necessary space for a child to explore these aspects in their own pace. A playscape is thus an extension of the classroom, a necessary aspect of every school.

With increasing awareness and support from different stakeholders at the grassroot and policy level, we can make playspace equity a reality.

India is blessed with a diverse cultural landscape with tribal districts scattered across various states including Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Rajasthan, among others. Children in these aspirational districts have a right to play and thrive in a childhood that will enable their physical and mental well-being. Through our work at Anthill, we wish to take our climbers, playstations, swings and more to every child in India, even if the concept of a playground is unknown to them. Let's show them a different way to explore the world and themselves!

A DREAM COME TRUE

Having the 1st Anthill playground in Tripura is an accomplishment I hold close to my heart. My dream to build a playground in my home state started right when I joined Anthill Creations (approx. 4 years ago) and my wish for the same is finally fulfilled now with this project with NPCI.

The process has been tumultuous with various rejections as well as helping hands from various government departments. Finally we could incorporate the playground into the ongoing state government initiative of "Vidyajyoti-Mission 100 schools" and present the children with such a colourful space. Wishing smiles for children all across!



PLAYFUL TRAILS: EMPOWERING THE NORTHEAST THROUGH PLAY

Arunachal Pradesh Sikkim Meghalaya Manipur Tripura Mizoram

There are over 67000 schools in the Northeast India and over 4723700 children do not have access to play. With a focus on aspirational districts, this project aims to bring play to government schools in remote regions. Playful Trails will include building upcycled playgrounds that enable physical, cognitive and socioemotional development in children during their developmental ages.



TYRES TO SMILES: TRANSFORMING 100 TONS OF TYRES INTO PLAYGROUNDS



A single playground is built by upcycling anywhere between 300 -600kgs of tyres. Tyres to Smiles aims to convert 100 tons of tyres to interactive, colourful playgrounds across states that discard highest number of tyres, namely Karnataka, Maharashtra, Tamilnadu, Delhi and Gujarat.

THE GAME LAB ANTHILL X NOTABOT
